### **Class 25 – Chairman's Choice - Apple and cinnamon (Diabetic) Cake**

1 heaped tbsp artificial sweetener  
 100g plain flour  
 1 level tsp ground cinnamon  
 6g baking powder  
 3 eggs  
 3 level tbsp skimmed milk  
 75g low-fat spread, melted  
 1kg dessert apples

#### **Method**

- 1: Oven 200 degrees C / gas 6. Grease tin 23 cm in diameter.
- 2: Sieve flour, sweetener, baking powder, cinnamon into bowl.
- 3: Whisk the eggs and milk together and add to dried ingredients, then fold the melted low -fat spread to the mixture and set aside.
- 4: Peel and core apples, cut into large slices add to mixture and fold in gently.
- 5: Add mixture to greased tin and bake for 35 mins or until cooked.

### **Class 26 – Judge's Choice – Farm House Cider and Marmalade Cake**

12oz self-raising flour  
 6oz salted butter  
 6oz demerara sugar  
 10oz mixed dried fruit  
 1 x large orange (zest and juice)  
 2 eggs  
 3 tbsp orange marmalade  
 ½ pint cider

#### **Method**

1. Pre heat the oven to gas mark 4 or 180 electric
2. Grease and line a 7inch round tin
3. Sieve the flour into a bowl. Rub in the butter until it is breadcrumb consistency
4. Stir the sugar, mixed dried fruit and the zest of the orange into the breadcrumbs mixture and stir thoroughly.

5. In a separate bowl whisk the eggs, marmalade, cider and the juice of the orange together. When mixed pour into the breadcrumb mixture and stir until thoroughly combined.
6. Pour the mixture into the greased/lined cake tin and place in the oven for approx. 1 ½ hours/
